Her "way" with stallions made for a natural progression into standing and breeding them.



Having earned her USDF bronze and silver medals on her long time companion "Caesar", Gina is eager to earn the Gold. She had solid chance in 2004 with the Dutch Warmblood Pinto stallion "Fine Art". Tragically, Fine Art died unexpectedly and suddenly. Gina was heart broken and left without a suitable mount to continue her goals. She lost her beloved Caesar the same year.

Watch for Gina this season, she will surely be on a mission! Not only is she working toward the USDF Gold Medal, but she has big plans for Bente D in the Grand Prix arena.
